Several families have asked about changing the way you enter your livestock for the county fair. The state fair and KJLS both use family nominations to enter livestock. This means that when you bring your beef to get weighed and tagged for the spring weigh in, we will tag all the steers for your family but not for you as an individual. The same with sheep, goats and pigs. When you do your pre fair entries, you decide then which animal belongs to which youth. We feel this will help all participants in case of a death or weight issue or other problems that could occur. #### **Updated 2020 State Fair FCS Judging Contest Information**

Date of Contest: Saturday, September 19, 2020 Contest Open from 9 am to 9 pm Youth ages 9-13, as of January 1 of the current year, are eligible to participate in the Intermediate division.

Youth ages 14-19 as of January 1 of the current year, are eligible to participate in the Senior Division.

The contest is open to all Kansas 4-H members in the 9-18 age bracket ONLY for 2020 - NO qualifying contest is required. There is not a limit on the number of participants a county may send.

#### **Contest Details:**

- The contest will be offered in a virtual format. Specific contest details will be emailed to the participant at the email address provided during pre-entry.
- Virtual Contest will be held on Saturday, September 19. The contest will be available from 9 am to 9 pm.
- Contestants will participate as an individual instead of as a team for this year only.
- FOR 2020 ONLY: Class judging will be the only component
- Intermediates will have 5 classes
- Seniors will have 6 classes
- All cell phones and other communication devices must be turned off while participating in the contest. The expectation is that you are doing this contest independently no use of extra help (search engines, study guides, parents/adults).
- If accommodations need to be made for participants (reading of questions, internet access), please answer yes to the question in the registration link.
- Contest answers will be e-mailed after 24 hours of contest completion so participants can get feedback.
- Awards to the top individuals (intermediate & senior) will be an educational FCS related trip for reimbursement (up to \$100) to be used for registration fee and travel expenses. Ideas include "Wild about FCS" event at Kansas State University; facility tours; leadership experience; artisan events/conferences.

The 2020 FCS state fair contest will include three components: 1) judging classes 2)a Group Think and 3) a hands-on puzzle room experience. For 2020, intermediate youth will have classes from five topics and seniors will have six topics. The categories that will be used for both age divisions are carry-on luggage, fast food, ground transportation, place settings, and wearable technology. The seniors will also have brewing coffee as the sixth topic. These categories are chosen from the same list that the Western National Roundup uses for their contest. The judging classes will be based on the previously mentioned categories. The Group Think activity is modeled from the Western National Roundup. In this activity, youth work as a team to come up with a solution to the challenge presented. There will also be a puzzle room experience which will involve the group working together to solve a series of puzzles.

Training will begin at 8 am Saturday, November 7, and conclude Sunday, November 8, after lunch.

The general session will be held online and will need to be completed prior to final registration (not this survey). If online training was completed earlier this year for spring training, it would still be accepted. Instructions and details will be released along with registration information.

The estimated cost will be \$225 per registrant, which includes two nights (Friday and Saturday), five meals, and training materials. Two people per room will be required. Options will be available for local individuals to register for a reduced rate without lodging.

Jr. Apprentice training will not be available. Apprentice training will be available if there is space.

Schedules and further information will be released soon. Details may change due to COVID-19 restrictions.

If you are interested in this training and agree to be a county leader, the county will cover the cost of this training.
